- Took on responsibility of Ticket Secretary her legendary skill of painlessly extracting money in exchange for dance tickets ensured the success of Branch social functions
- Took on responsibility for catering arrangements and food preparation for Branch social functions on the retirement of Joan Roberts a role that continued to the present. The success of Branch social functions was in no small measure due to the outstanding suppers that dancers enjoyed
